2020 Impact Grantee Nourish Now Delivers 3 Million+ Meals



Since the beginning of the pandemic, Nourish Now, the 2020 recipient of the Many Hands \$100,000 Impact Grant, has provided more than 4 million pounds of food to individuals and families facing food insecurity. Nourish Now partners with 11 other nonprofits to distribute food from 20 locations in Montgomery County, including schools, churches, and apartment complexes. This network allows them to provide families living in 41 out of 45 Montgomery County zip codes with a five-day supply of nonperishable food plus milk, produce, and freshly prepared meals.

2019 Partner Grantee CASA Prince George's County - One Year Later

Court Appointed Special Advocates (CASA)/Prince George's County describes its receipt of a 2019 Many Hands Partner Grant as "transformative" for its efforts to help transition-aged youth (14-21) living in foster care navigate the important milestones that prepare a young person for independence and adulthood.



With the \$58,500 grant, CASA launched a new Job Readiness Initiative to prepare foster youth to emancipate with job readiness skills and employment opportunities. In its first year, the program connected 40 transition-aged youth to programs offering soft skills training, GED preparation, and technical training in such fields as customer service, HVAC, performing arts, and healthcare. Participants also received assistance in creating resumes and one-on-one coaching to help them secure employment. Once they found employment, their CASA volunteers continued to provide support in seeking advancement, transportation assistance, and long-term goal setting.

Too many youth in foster care begin their first employment search on their own with no one to help them complete the application, prepare for the interview, manage the daily commute, and work through the frustrations that come with working in a new environment. CASA/Prince George's County's Job Readiness Initiative gives transition-aged youth the support they need
