Tutor from Home with Generation Hope



2020 Partner Grantee Generation Hope is looking for virtual tutors for the children of its scholars. Generation Hope scholars are teen parents pursuing a college education. COVID-19 has forced many of them to juggle their own virtual learning and that of their children. Tutors will help scholars' children stay on track academically and while giving scholars more time to focus on their work.

Tutors will ideally have experience working with elementary school age children and be able to help them navigate the virtual learning

experience. The typical time commitment will be once a week for about an hour.
