



DC's Maternal Mortality Crisis - Thursday, November 12



Join Many Hands for a timely look at DC's maternal mortality crisis with Andria Cornell (Association of Maternal & Child Health Programs) and Ebony Marcelle (Community of Hope, a 2004 Many Hands Partner Grantee). The maternal death rate in the District of Columbia is more than 50% higher than the average for the United States, which in turn has the worst maternal health outcomes in the developed world. Former Many Hands Board member and award-winning journalist Jill Rosenbaum Meyer will moderate the discussion, which will examine the forces driving this crisis and ask how we can improve outcomes for DC women and their newborns.

New! Introducing Installment Payment Plans

Many Hands is pleased to announce that you can now make your membership contribution in installments. There are two payment plans, which can be fulfilled by check or credit card. Payments under the two-installment plan are due December 15 and April 15. Payments under the four-installment plan are due November 15, December 15, February 15, and April 15. You will receive an email reminder before each due date. Members must be current on



payments as of December 31 in order to be eligible to serve on a Focus Area Committee. Homestretch Celebrates 30th Anniversary



Congratulations to two-time Partner Grantee Homestretch as they celebrate 30 years of giving families experiencing homelessness the skills, knowledge, and hope they need to achieve their goals. Since 1990, Homestretch has helped over 2,000 families achieve permanent housing and self-

sufficiency.

According to Executive Director Christopher Fay, over 90% of Homestretch graduates never return to homelessness, a record of success that is unparalleled nationwide. Fay notes, "The Homestretch model proves that given the right support, homeless families can turn their lives around in dramatic ways. We hope in the years to come to inspire others to follow our example and adopt our model, as they battle homelessness in their own communities. We are very grateful for Many Hands, whose generous grant allowed us to serve more families in need." Homestretch received Many Hands Partner Grants in 2020 and 2016.

Horton's Kids: Expanding and in the News

It has been a busy fall for Horton's Kids. On October 29, the 2014 Impact Grantee opened a second Community Resource Center in the Stanton Oaks area of Washington, DC, just up the road from their current Wellington Park location. The new location will allow them to support more families and children in DC's Ward 8, where the poverty rate for families with children is nearly 150% higher than the citywide average.



Horton's Kids works to ensure that every child has the opportunity to graduate from high school ready to succeed in college, career, and life. Throughout the pandemic, in addition to their ongoing efforts, they have focused on providing kids with the technology and Internet access they need to support distance learning.
